In 2022 the club received a grant from BC Parks to purchase and install new trail signage. This winter, eight club volunteers along with two park rangers installed new signs for both summer hiking and winter ski routes, as well as tagging many routes where the trail tags were faded or missing. Over 300 tags were put up along the Mayne Lake, Tannis Lake, and Gilbert Lake trails as well as from Victor's Landing to Batchelor cabin. Our work was highlighted by BC Parks on their website to promote this year's grants (which we will likely ap-

This was our first year back doing club trips after a two year break due to the pandemic. Following our September hiking trip to Kees and Claire hut on the Spearhead traverse, we were back at Whistler in December for some early season


skiing in December. A number of club members purchased Whistler 5 day Edge Cards, which include free early season skiing. To take advantage of this we booked a townhouse in the Whistler benchlands Dec 6-9. Although Whistler only had some of the runs open at that time of year, there was still plenty of good skiing to be had, especially on the last day when it snowed 10-20 cm. And at that time of year there are no lift lines! Add in some excellent food and drink, an outdoor hot tub, and even some world cup soccer games and it made for a very enjoyable week which we'll be repeating this coming December.





In February we were back to the Kees and Claire hut for a winter trip. After a few last minute cancellations, 10 of us ended up going to the new ACC hut on the Spearhead traverse. We were lucky that the -30C temperatures of the previous week had settled down to a more manageable -10 to -15C. Still chil-

ly but that made for some great snow and ski conditions. Weather could definitely be considered "variable" and we were unable to ski above the hut due to visibility concerns. (At one point we were forced back into the cabin only 15 minutes after we left because sunny skies had



We also ran two shorter trips into Tetrahedron Park this winter. Michel Frenette led a day trip to Edwards cabin in January, attended by a small group of skiers and snowshoers. Unfortunately the weather did not cooperate, with very wet conditions. But better conditions were had for an overnight trip into McNair cabin led by cabin stewards Danny Fleischhacker and Melissa Rayfield.







Upcoming Activities

Our major cabin project this summer will be the replacement of the roof at the Steele cabin. Its getting old and some leaks have been showing up. Cabin stewards Bryce and Alex are planning to have a new metal roof flown in and installed sometime in August, along with some other repairs to the stairs and outhouse.



We are also planning to have the main trail brushed from the upper parking lot to Edwards Lake. It has been several years since it was last done and is beginning to get overgrown. This work will be contracted out and hopefully completed in the next few weeks prior to summer. More trail signage will also be installed.

For next year we are hoping to replace the Chapman bridge (what's left of it) with a new bridge, similar to what was done at Steele creek last year. Right now we are in the planning stages and looking for grant funding, as this will be a major expense.
